"By Grace"

In Bible study the other day a member shared an interesting story. He was telling about how he met with two younger people for a dinner meeting. (Now when I mean younger, they were in their twenties. Yes, it pains me to say those in their twenties are considered young to me now. Ugh!). Anyway, he shared how somehow the topic of faith and church came up. They shared how they didn't feel good enough for church.

It was a statement that really saddened me as I heard it. I know we can at times come off as judgmental and heavy-handed as the church as we preach the law in our sermons or still call things sin that the world now accepts. I know we might come off at times a bit righteous compared to others as we exercise and express those things. However, it is precisely for those who aren't good enough, who can't be good enough, that the church is supposed to exist. It is supposed to be a place where people hear about God's grace and experience God's grace.

It is because not one person who has ever made up Christ's church or ever been held up in Scripture as an instrument of God's pleasure and will can say they lived a good enough life to be declared righteous before Him. All have needed His grace. Abraham lied and told the Egyptians his wife was his sister out of fear. It was not a righteous act. He slept with his wife's servant girl. He should have said no, but he didn't.

Isaac favored his wayward son out of selfishness. He liked his cooking, so he was going to bless him against the Lord's will. Jacob tricked his brother and uncle and favored one son above his others.

Moses killed a man in anger, tried to convince God not to use him, and was almost killed by the Lord for not circumcising his son. Despite being the man the Lord chose to lead His people Israel and receive His Law, Moses had his warts too.

King David took many wives and committed adultery with the wife of another. King Solomon clearly ignored the Lord's warning and wisdom about taking many wives and led his people poorly in his last years as he accepted idolatry and practiced it.

In the New Testament, Peter denied and abandoned. Paul persecuted and arrested and showed great hatred toward Christians before his conversion. John and James and the disciples argued over who would be the greatest among them in Christ's kingdom. They were thinking about who would be more deserving of glory from Jesus. They all had their moments of weakness and missteps in sin.

Just like, not one of those listed in the Lord's Hall of Fame of faith in Hebrews 11 lived a perfect life in which moments of sin could not be found in their lives, yet the Lord still chose them and used them. Why? Because if the Lord had to rely on perfect people to carry out his will on earth and make up his church, it would be empty.

It is why we can be so grateful for His grace and if we aren't conveying that or teaching that as Christ's church, then we need to reevaluate our words and actions.

Grace is, by its definition, something undeserved, yet it is what our Father in heaven chose to show us through His Son. We all deserve His worst for our sins, just like there were many times when the Lord could have given up on Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and Moses and David and others for their sins and lack of faith, but He didn't. He showed grace.

He chose to forgive their transgressions and show mercy because while they were those sinners, they would also be examples of His grace for all of us.

Yes, the Lord always calls us to repentance over our sins and to not just live in them. He gave us His Law to show us what sin is, but He knew in giving it that it would be broken. Therefore, the Father sent His Son to take our place under the Law, under the punishment His Law demands, so we could be forgiven and set free from that punishment. He did it, so we could live forever with Him through the grace and forgiveness He offers us all in His Son. It is the grace and salvation we receive when we believe Jesus, as that Son, is the Savior needed for our lives. It is why it says, "For it is by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."

Jesus came from the Father full of grace and truth (John 1:14). He demonstrated it in the mercy he showed prostitutes and adulterers and tax collectors and sinners throughout his ministry and He demonstrated it for you and me when he occupied that cross for our sins.

Therefore, if you ever think you are not good enough for Christ's church, Jesus would say, "You are not, but I was for you! My holy blood shed says you can be redeemed of all your sin and my holy body laid down says you have been saved by my grace. You have a place in My church and in my home forever. I have made that place for you!"

As it says in I Thessalonians 5:9-11, "For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep (in death), we might live with Him. Therefore, encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing."




BOOKS FOR THE LIBRARY

July 7 – Pentecost VII

Surprise pregnancy and terminal diagnosis confront us with our own weakness. It even leads some to exclude embryos or incapacitated persons from humankind and execute them because of their weakness. Almighty God promises, "My power is made perfect precisely in your weaknesses." His grace radiates in human frailty, and the blessings He brings in every life more than make up for what we cannot.

July 14 - Pentecost VIII

Choice does matter when it comes to surprise pregnancies and terminal diagnoses. But it is the Heavenly Father's choice that makes the difference (Ephesians 1:4-5). He summoned every life even before our circumstances, and He sustains each one even when we don't find the circumstances ideal. Likewise, the Lord God's delight for adoption invites us to advocate and engage in welcoming orphans.

July 21 - Pentecost IX

The world wants to discriminate between lives it finds worthy and ones it regards as undeserving. The coming of Christ Jesus has brought about something better – reconciliation that has dissolved all division and abolished hostility in God's forgiveness and fellowship (Ephesians 2:14-17). His kingdom leaves neither need nor room for discounting anyone because of shade, shape, sex, age, income, education, or residence.

July 28 - Pentecost X

Fatherhood embodies the gift and the work of God Himself (Ephesians 3:15). In bringing forth life from their very bodies, our Heavenly Father makes men into His instruments and agents. He expects a strong love from them because He has endowed them with His own. Let us encourage them to protect their children even when inconvenient and provide for mothers even if difficult.

August 4 – Pentecost XI

Abortion and euthanasia require twisting words and redefining terms. With craftiness and deceit (Ephesians 4:14) they do not only protest laws and beliefs but ultimately grumble against God (Exodus 16:8). Jesus the Savior instead offers the truth and love that every life is His gift (John 6:33). And He enthusiastically invites Christian citizens to share His joy by speaking and showing it.

August 11 – Pentecost XII

Elijah the prophet once considered his life not worth the living. In love the Lord God did not affirm his autonomy but set about to convince him otherwise (1 Kings 19:4-5). Since Jesus imparts also unto us the relief of entrusting all things to our Almighty Maker (John 6:38), couldn't our sanctity-of-life advocacy extend the same privileges to anxious and endangered neighbors?

August 18 – Pentecost XIII

The Word of the Lord quite clearly declares, "Do not become partners with the sons of disobedience" (Ephesians 5:6-7). It does not allow the luxury of concluding, "I wouldn't abort, but I won't tell anyone else what to do." Our God and Father has commissioned us to expose the works of darkness and not to accommodate or compromise. Indeed, we get to displace these evils with the words of eternal life (John 6:68)!

August 25 – Pentecost XIV

The Gospel of Jesus Christ liberates us from living for ourselves alone. We reside in the hands of Almighty God like clay and potter (Isaiah 29:16). So we don't have to settle for "my body, my choice." Instead, we get to benefit from Him deciding life and death on our behalf. May our marriages and parenting replicate the magnificent way Christ and Church abandon themselves to one another (Ephesians 5:22-23).
