

"Give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all"

Last week in my sermon, I began by pointing out fun generational differences. Like I saw a cartoon where this dad has his young son on his lap and his son has a cell phone in his hand, and then the dad says to him, "When I was your age, the whole family had to gather around just one screen."

I had to chuckle because it definitely illustrates the difference between my childhood and my kids. When I was growing up, we would gather around one screen in the living room on Friday nights to watch shows like "Home Improvement" and "Family Matters", now we can have a show on in our living room and none of my kids are watching it because they are all on other screens. The time we live in!

Now we could say our generational differences are pretty stark these days, yet differences in generations have always existed. In fact, did you know Paul in his writings addresses these generational differences? In some places, he addresses older men in the congregation. In other places, he addresses older women. He also has specific teachings for younger men and also younger women. I thought I would share some of them with you.

To older men, he says, "Older men are to be sober-minded (or temperate or sober with regard to alcohol), dignified (or worthy of respect), self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness (Titus 2:2)."

To older women, he says, "Older women likewise are to be reverent in behavior, not slanderers or slaves to much wine. They are to teach what is good, and so train the younger women to love their husbands and children (Titus 2:4)."

It also talks about how they are encouraged to also be modest, chaste, kind and be respectful (as in submissive) to their husbands.

In I Peter 5:5, young men are addressed where it says, "Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

Also in Titus 2:6, it says, "Likewise, urge the younger men to be self-controlled (or sensible)."

In other words, younger men are not to be carried away by their youthful passions and pride, but seek to be humble and sensible and respectful toward their elders.

The New Testament does not address younger women specifically, but it does address young widows and unmarried women and wives of husbands. It talks about adorning one's self with a gentle and quiet spirit (I Peter 3:4) rather than just worrying about adorning yourself in your physical appearance. It talks about being faithful wives to your husbands in both word and deed (I Peter 3:1-6, Ephesians 5:22-24).

Ultimately, the Lord is saying to us, no matter our age, that we are to live lives seeking to glorify Christ through our words and actions. It means treating each other with respect despite our generational differences. It means living soberly and modestly toward the Lord and others. It means being sound in faith, and love and steadfastness or patient endurance as we live ever with the challenges and temptations of this world. It means showing this most especially to our spouses and family and fellow believers, as Galatians 6:10 says, "So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith."

Therefore, as protests on college campuses rage and political tensions continue to be enflamed here and abroad with sometimes that rage and anger being directed toward other peoples or generations, let us keep the Word of God in mind no matter our age.

As it says in Romans 12:9-17, "Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. ¹⁰ Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹ Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. ¹³ Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality. ¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be conceited. ¹⁷ Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all." Amen.


BOOKS FOR THE LIBRARY

Lutherans For Life

May 5 - Easter VI

Surprise pregnancy does involve difficulties too great for our abilities. Terminal diagnosis indeed comes with insurmountable obstacles. Taking life-and-death matters into one's own hands only compounds the problems. Instead, trust the Son of God to overcome and deliver out of every threat (1 John 5:4). Cry out to Jesus in repentance and prayer, for the Father above will not fail to supply immediate and eternal salvation (John 15:16).

May 12 - Easter VII/Mother's Day

The world ridicules motherhood as hindrance. It complains that children get in the way of education, career, income, gratification, and even climate. But the testimony of God is greater than the testimony of men (1 John 5:9). Real life and full life come in Christ Jesus, His Son, who shows us the joy of loving and keeping every daughter and son the Holy Father gives (John 17:11-12).

May 19 – Pentecost

The Holy Spirit means to make a dwelling place of every human body (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). The Scriptures explicitly apply this mission to old and young, male or female (Acts 2:17), and even the unborn (Psalm 139:13). We have the invitation and commission to proclaim this prophetic message to a culture that beholds some neighbors as lifeless bones (Ezekiel 37:2-3). Let His precious breath of life (Genesis 2:7) inspire us all!

May 26 – Holy Trinity

The truth of Father, Son, and Spirit proves that God loves relationship, family, and community. He gives these blessings no matter how young or old (John 3:4-5), even inhabiting the womb or entering the tomb. The One who creates, redeems, and calls every human being reigns as Lord over life and death (Acts 2:36). Abortion and assisted suicide are idolatrous, and Jesus has come to save from it (John 3:17).
